

Principles

1. As National Governing Body, England Hockey has overall responsibility for the sport in England

- 2. There is a fundamental role for local organisation and decision making
- 3. Clarification of accountability of all organising bodies to their stakeholders and ultimately to England Hockey is required
- 4. Simplification of structure should be the aim to make it easier for all involved
- 5. Clarity of purpose is key for all organising bodies
- 6. Common principles of governance are necessary for all organising bodies


7. Consistency of overarching policies, rules and regulations is required for all aspects relating to playing hockey*



Berkshire Hockey Association School Competitions

- 76 schools receive BHA Schools' Hockey Competition information
- Since 2018, 29 State & 30 Private schools have participated
- 2019-20 140 teams entered tournaments (105 girls & 35 boys)
- 2019-20 69 teams entered In2Hockey (U/11,U12,U13 Boys & Girls)
- Tournaments are inclusive with Round Robin groups of 4/5 teams, followed by 'Cup' and 'Plate' Matches in groups of 4/5 teams followed by semi finals and finals

Essex Hockey Association Emerging School Competition

- Targeted at schools who do not enter EH Competitions
- Facility hire and coaches funded by Essex HA, especially in areas of socio-economic deprivation
- Morning session coach led with staff and pupils
- Afternoon session informal cup competition, umpired by the coaches, who mentored the teachers running their teams
- Follow on this season Schools linked to their local hockey club, funding available for coaches to deliver sessions in the school leading up to the School Competition Day
- All equipment supplied by Essex HA (if required)



Devon Hockey Association Club Engagement

- Club Forums 5 per year (Sept, Jan & May) Based in Exeter and Plymouth to limit travel, continued in lockdown virtually. Average attendance 25 out of 34 clubs.
- Each Forum has a focus for example, Ways to Play
- Club feedback from Forums actioned by Devon HA for example, Free Coach Observation Sessions
- Excellent opportunity to engage with clubs, share good practice and enable clubs to support each other. External partners to support delivery England Hockey, Active Devon



Restarting/Developing Youth Section – Suffolk HA

•CAREFULLY DEFINE OVERALL OBJECTIVES – Player Pathway (PP), Competition and Youth Development Delivery – creates Internal/External rules = Constitution. •GENERATE ACTIVE SUPPORT – from Club, School, County, Pitch owners, Region, EH and Parents. With volunteers you have no stick, only the carrot of saying thanks and meaning it. •RECRUIT COMMITTED PASSIONATE STAFF – Recruit Suitable Core Exec for Admin/Leadership including PP Administrator (paid), set Regular Meetings & Succession, Job Specs, Reputable Qualified & Certified Coaching Staff, Contracts, Coach education. Delegate, delegate, delegate. •CREATE RESOURCES – Cash, Finance/Book-keeping/Accounts/Event Costings, PP Coaching Squad Kit, Beg and Borrow. generate Goodwill whenever possible, value everyone's time. •ESTABLISH COMMUNICATIONS – 2-way comms with ALL Supporters (above), create active Website. Establish lines of responsibility and communicate accordingly. Keep parents happy. ••CREATE PLAN / EXECUTE IT / REVIEW IT / AMEND IT. Value, weigh and act on feedback, not gossip, but don't be diverted by either.

Yorkshire Men's Development League

To provide an opportunity for young players to make an easy transfer from junior hockey to adult hockey alongside and with the support of experienced players and coaches

• The principle ethos of the league is "opportunity, experience and development", for players and young umpires including the social side, to retain young players in hockey.

- No special rules for this league, only guidelines, aimed "to provide a safe environment for the development of the young players in both teams". No adults can score goals.
- Teams comprise 7/9 juniors and 3/5 experienced players/adults, with a minimum of 3 adults and 6 juniors on the pitch at any time.
- Juniors would be U15 (including U13's if appropriate) and not regularly playing in normal adult teams. Ladies or suitable girls to play in men's development teams as long as the opposition have no objection and maximum of 1 lady and 4 girls.
- The choice of senior players is very important as they must be able to support the young players.
- Key to contact the organiser of your opponent's team early to compare playing standards.
- A maximum of 10 teams in any Development league to ensure no more than 18 matches in a season, with no promotion or relegation.



Surrey HA 2019-2020

- Area covered Surrey, South West London (will move to Surrey 'County Council' geographical area from 2021-22)
- 44 Affiliated Clubs
- Player Pathway 2 squads U13/16 and 1 U17 per gender (450) players. PC players do not play at AC level (100 accepted nominations per cycle)
- DC camps are run over summer holidays 12 camps 1300 players from 68 schools and 25 clubs
- In2Hockey 237 entries, 23 from state schools split into regional rounds (all are invited to nominate to Player Pathway)
- School U14/U18 All require regional rounds representation at all tiers
- SHA give financial grants to clubs and schools including £10k worth of GK kit per annum
